

## **TEACHING**

#### European Union Policies course

European Union Policies is a mandatory course offered to 2nd-year students in International Relations and European Studies. European Union Policies serves as a model of teaching the EU with the support of digital technologies for stimulating the consolidation of the digital skills of the students enrolled in this course.

The course is divided into four modules: What are EU Policies? (8 hours), Theoretical approaches and instruments(16 hours), History and Evolution of EU Policies(16 hours), Case studies(16 hours) on the new member states(RO and Bulgaria).

The course European Union Policies is one of the core disciplines in the International Relations and European Studies Curriculum. This course has crossed significant changes over the years in terms of academic content, pedagogical approaches or instructors responsible for the teaching activities. The module leader(dr. Cuglesan) has taught this course for several years; the current proposal represents the outcome of a long process of reflection and several years of teaching this course in terms of designing the teaching activities in order to meet the needs of the students for academic and labour market purposes. The current version of the course and seminar activities represents the perfect blend between policy analysis skills, a top-down approach(knowledge of the history and evolution of EU Policies) and bottom-up approaches (case studies on the member states) as well as consolidation of academic writing, research skills and digital competences.


### **AUTHOR WORKSHOP**

National Coordination and the European Union

#### 23-24 November, Magdeburg

Dr Cugleşan, D-SKILLS Jean Monnet Module Leader, has participated in the Workshop organised by the Jean Monnet Chair Multi-level Governance in the EU on the issue of the EU Affairs National Coordination Systems.

The D-SKILLS Module leader will contribute with a chapter on the case of Romania.

SUNY Global Center, New York, March 30-April 1st, 2023

Dr Cugleşan, D-SKILLS Jean Monnet Module Leader, participated in the 2023 edition of the SUNY MEU in New York between March 30 and April 1.

Also, dr. Cugleşan served on the expert witness panel for approximately 100 students who negotiated for two days a diverse agenda which ranged from issues related to artificial intelligence, EU-China relations or climate change and energy issues. The witness panel aimed to clarify and offer insights into the problems that the students tackled during SUNY MEU.







<u>Democracy without liberalism. Dealing</u> with populism in the EU

Mr Alain Lamassoure, a member of the European Parliament for four terms(1989-2019), was invited in the framework of the EP to Campus Programme on October 20 to discuss virtually with students in Security Studies and International Relations and European Studies from the Department of International Studies and Contemporary History on the challenges of populism and democracy in the EU.

The lecture mapped the state of democracy in the EU. It advanced the remedies the EU should employ to respond to growing illiberalism and democratic backsliding in the EU.

European Integration and the Constitutional Identity of North Macedonia.

Prof Goran Ilik addressed the issue of EU decision-making instruments used by the European Union to advance integration. The lecture focused on the Enhanced Cooperation Mechanism(EnC) instituted as a flexible tool under the Amsterdam Treaty and further extended by the Nice and Lisbon Treaty to new areas such as the CFSP and defence sphere.

The lecture has exemplified the areas where the Enhanced Cooperation Mechanism has been applied, such as the Patent or Divorce Law or the establishment of the European Public Prosecutor's Office (EPPO).

May 13, 2023 Time: 16.00 Where: Zoom Prof. Ilik argued that the EnC can act as a foderator of the EU. The presentation used the "dynamic core federator" concept, advanced by Karl W. Deutsch in 1957, as a balancer between the federation units and protector of the whole from the domination of a single member or a group of members.

The lecture was attended by undergraduate students in European Studies enrolled in the EU Policies and Multi-level Governance in the European Union classes.

The online lecture ended with a Q and A session.



Bulgaria in NATO and the Russian hybrid war against Bulgaria to question its geostrategic choice

During her lecture, Professor Tatayna Dronzina discussed the issue of hybrid war and disinformation narratives used by the Putin regime in the context of Russian aggression against Ukraine. The presentation aimed to familiarize students with the concept of hybrid war and how Russia uses it to question Bulgaria's role in NATO.

The lecture began with explanation of the concept of hybrid war and its characteristics. The presentation then focused on the pro-EU and pro-Russian political parties in Bulgaria, and moved on to inventory an of the main disinformation narratives on the Russian war against Ukraine.

Professor Dronzina's discussion shed light on the complex issues surrounding hybrid warfare and disinformation, providing valuable insights for the students.

The lecture ended with a Q and A session with the students.









#### GLOBE SIMULATION, 5-8 December, 2022


GLOBE is a mix of a traditional simulation game and crisis management exercise where students virtually navigate through a simulated conflict scenario in the Sahel region, focusing on Mali's security and humanitarian situation.



A team of five students(Reanasinta Diva, Claudia Pop, Daniel Coca, Tudor Dolhăscu, and Raul Ianoș) from the BA programme in Security and Studies MA programme Leadership and Communication in International Organisations from the Department of International Studies and Contemporary History participated the **GLOBE** in Simulation programme.

## The right to have digital rights in the European Union. A step towards digital citizenship?

Abstract: The chapter investigates the EU approach to building digital citizenship and its human-centric and value-orientated strategy to extend the rights that apply offline also in the digital environment. It focuses on the Digital Rights and Principles interinstitutional declaration, a manifesto of EU beliefs on what digital rights represent. The paper argues that the EU's understanding of digital rights builds extensively on fundamental rights, such as the right to privacy, by adding new developments, such as the right to digital legacy or by extending other fundamental rights, such as the right to education in the digital world. Still, at the same, it has contributed to the emergence of new rights that do not fall into the category of fundamental rights, such as the right to a digital identity or internet access or to file complaints under AI, which resulted from current global realities. As such, the EU has adapted to technological advancements and protected user rights in the digital space, scoring as a normative digital global actor.
